# Reconciliation Ministries. New Name. Renewed Vision.

In 2003, Youth Hope Inc. opened its doors as a faith-based organization assisting troubled and underprivileged youth, and in 2010, Elev8 was created to respond to the needs of the St. Andrews area. In December of 2016, Youth Hope Inc. and Elev8 merged and changed their name to Elevate Columbia. During this season, Elevate Columbia provided holistic services to members of the St. Andrews area by providing after school and summer camp programs, a community garden, life skills classes, athletic summer camps, and recovery programs. However, from 2016 until this point, we have seen an urgent need for recovery programs. God has positioned qualified staff members, opened doors to properties, and provided the necessary resources to grow this particular focal point of Elevate Columbia. As we enter into the next season we have decided, with much prayerful consideration, that changing our name to Reconciliation Ministries captures the heart of what is taking place within the programs and helps us to have a unified, specific focal point.

The name Reconciliation Ministries was laid on Pastor Lucky Detty's heart 6 years ago after he completed a recovery program. It stems from 2 Corinthians 5:18, "All this is from God, who reconciled us

The arrow up represents reconciliation to God, the arrow inward represents reconciliation to self, and the arrow outward represents reconciliation to others.
